What's your story/topic idea?

What photographs, documents or artifacts can students use to explore the story?

How would you connect students to the topic? *I.e.* site visit, service-learning project, pre-made lesson plan, etc.

What resources can you provide to students? *I.e.* books and materials, staff assistance with research, a website, etc.

What broader academic and career skills can students gain from this project? I.e. critical thinking, analyzing sources, communication, organization, etc.

Keep in mind that anything you come up with will have to work within the limitations of the school's schedule, curriculum focus, and resources.
