The Maysville Museum

Presque Isle Historical Society, celebrating its 60th anniversary in 2023, invites you to visit our Maysville Museum, named a “Distinctive Destination” by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. This small museum sits in a renovated one-room schoolhouse on a site that served simultaneously as the Maysville Town Hall, the Maysville Grange, and the Maysville District School. Maysville was the town between Presque Isle and Caribou that was annexed by Presque Isle in 1883.

The museum features four cornerstone exhibits (The Aroostook War, Presque Isle & the Civil War, Agri-CULTURE, and Presque Isle’s one-room schoolhouses), a working antique telephone switchboard, several smaller displays, and two new exhibits each year. For 2023, the annual exhibits are on Edward Wiggin and Phrenology. There is also a gift shop available. Admission is free.

The museum, located at 165 Caribou Road in Presque Isle (corner of US Route 1 and the Brewer Road) will be open on Saturday, October 14 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
